

Experience Lent with love: Pope Francis

In his message for Lent 2021, the Pope asks people to "experience Lent with love," which "rejoices in seeing others grow."

"To experience Lent with love means caring for those who suffer or feel abandoned and fearful because of the COVID-19 pandemic. In these days of deep uncertainty about the future, let us keep in mind the Lord's word to his Servant, 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you' (Isaiah 43:1). In our charity, may we speak words of reassurance and help others to realise that God loves them as sons and daughters," Pope Francis wrote in the message published on Friday.

He emphasised that even a small amount of almsgiving when offered with "joy and simplicity" can multiply, as did "the loaves blessed, broken and given by Jesus to the disciples to distribute to the crowd".

"Love is a gift that gives meaning to our lives. It enables us to view those in need as members of our own family, as friends, brothers, or sisters. A small amount, if given with love, never ends, but becomes a source of life and happiness," the Pope said.

The liturgical season of Lent will begin this week on Ash Wednesday. The Vatican has instructed priests to distribute ashes by silently sprinkling them on people's heads this year due to the pandemic.
