



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. I write now to advise you of their appointments and the movement of clergy. I have made the following appointments:

As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples. Christian stewards respond in a particular way to the call of discipleship.


Stewardship is based on the understanding that all we have is gift from God.

Capricorn Coast Catholic Parish - Gifts of Time & Talent 2023

Brief Descriptions

Parish Leadership Group - together with the Parish Priest, they help to guide the pastoral needs and plans for the parish.

Parish Finance Team – Together with the Parish Priest, they help plan the spending and works projects of the parish, as well as developing strategies for income and investment.

Parish Safeguarding Team - Raising awareness of safeguarding, contact point, working with parish & diocesan office to ensure a safe place for all.

Media/I.T./Parish Photos – includes tasks such as working in the digital communications and taking photos/videos of activities within the parish, other opportunities may also be developed.

Adult Faith Formation Team – Develop and provide opportunities for adults in the parish to further their faith understanding and participation, such as presentations and guest speakers. This includes the likes of Alpha Course, which is being established in our parish.

State School Catechesis – Go into the local state schools to provide the Religious Instruction lessons for children at those schools.

Tabor Good Shepherd Atrium – Working in a team for catechesis of our young people (3-12 years of age, outside of the Mass times), formation is provided.

Sophia Library Group – With Sr Kym, at the Benedictine Monastery, they have a library that they have provided for the parish to access.

Scripture Study Group – provide some opportunity to study the Bible, whether a small group in the home with a casual reading approach or an established study program that is offered to the parish.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) – provides instructions and formation for adults wishing to join the Catholic faith and receive the Sacraments. People share their faith and journey.

Healing Prayer Ministry — is a particular prayer group that prays for people within the parish such as by being available after some Masses to pray with and over those who wish to come for prayer.
